MINUTES OF THE LOSTOCK GRALAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 7th NOVEMBER 2022 AT THE CHURCH HALL

1. PUBLIC FORUM

Cllr P Kelly reported that;

• The PCC was on TV talking about noisy cars.

- He does not agree that the PCSO speed enforcement results are a true reflection of speeding on Manchester Rd.
- Bar codes on litter bins report damaged bins using bar code.
- Cllr Stocks has agreed to fund a traffic Assessment for Manchester Rd although funds will not be available until after the Chester by-election.
- Fly tipping has occurred on a Manchester Rd field, with bank statements found within the waste-Clerk to report to CWAC.
- Mud is still on the pavement opposite the Cheshire Business Park the Clerk has reported the mud to CWAC and written to the farmer.
- MOP communication received regarding police sirens/lights to attend retail unit on Cheshire Avenue.

Cllr T Smith requested;

- An update from the Police & Crime Commissioner re meeting held in July.
- Contact commercial unit owner for an update regarding wall and fence railings.

Cllr P Walker suggested that the Church Hall could be an option for solar power funding grant application.

Cllr A Ross noted how nice the lamppost poppies look in the parish and suggested that the PC consider Christmas themed lamppost decorations for another year.

Cllr L Kelly raised concern about long grass at the cremation area of the churchyard.

5. PROGRESS REPORT

- -The weeds growing along Manchester Road have been reported to CWAC. CWAC has scheduled to spray weed killer the Clerk will monitor and chase up if the weeds show no sign of dying back.
- -The new paediatric defib pads have arrived and are now available with the defib. The Clerk will check the expected battery lifespan as it is now out of warranty.
- -The Clerk has reported the flood light which is not working along the Cheshire Av. alleyway.

7. CHRISTMAS PREPARATIONS & BUDGET

- -Inovyn has agreed to award the PC a grant of £500.00 for the light switch on party.
- -The PC **RESOLVED** to book Cheshire Parties at a cost of £150.00 due to Jon the Balloon Man no longer being available.
- -The PC **RESOLVED** that the Clerk should order 50 selection boxes for the school choir children approx. cost £50-£60 from Cadbury direct.
- -Roberts Bakery has agreed to donate a box of gingerbread men.
- -The PC RESOLVED that Cllr P Kelly and Cllr L Kelly will switch on the tree lights.
- -Cllr Venables is in the process of completing a Risk Assessment for the light switch on event. Cllr Venables will also be the fist aider for the event.
- -Poster and play area fence banner to be installed this week.
- -The Clerk and Cllr Hodgkinson will purchase the food and drinks items for the light switch on party on Thursday 24th November.
- -Children's and adult tombola along with a bric-a-brac table to be run by the Church.

10. HyNet Consultation

-Cllr M Venables was unable to attend the HyNet consultation, however he has looked into the consultation material and advised that the PC does not need to submit a response based on the proposed route not affecting Lostock Gralam.

11. (a) PLAY AREA

- -HAGS SMP Ltd has now carried out repair works at the play area. It was noted that the Clerk needs to query a missing bolt on the zip wire which should have been replaced.
- -Cllr Venables advised that cleaning materials will be purchased to enable the play equipment and entrance gates to be cleaned and algae removed as per the HAGS Operational inspection report. An allowance of £200.00 was agreed at the October PC meeting.

(b) OUTDOOR GYM PROJECT

-As per a meeting at the play area on 5th November, the preferred location for the adult gym equipment is between the Community Centre building and the play area. The Clerk will ask Broxap to inspect the suggested location and create an equipment location plan.

- Broxapt has advised that fencing should be installed to clearly separate the children's playground equipment from the fitness equipment.
- Cllr Venables suggested a two-bar fence be installed to ensure compliance.

Anti-Social Behaviour

- Report received of a broken window at Comms Care, those responsible have not been identified on the CCTV, but a suspect has been named, enquiries are ongoing. There has been a group of youths gathering around the Business Units, these have been spoken, and no reports have been received since.
- Reports of youths disrupting hirers are the Community Centre, those haven't been identified, due to the timescale the CCTV had been wiped over. Patrols planned to attend the Community Centre when the groups are meeting in the future to deter further problems.
- Vehicle damaged on the Cheshire Limes Estate by having paint thrown over it, no witnesses or CCTV to progress the investigation.
- Window broken on a property on Lodge Lane, no witnesses or CCTV to progress the investigation.
- Report of a group on youths damaging Halloween Decorations on a number of roads in the area, the group have been captured on CCTV, and some have been identified, they will be getting home visits in the next few days.

Road Safety

 Speed enforcement has been carried out on Manchester Road, 1 session has been carried out by the Slow & Easy, 8 offences recorded.
