Our Big Rotary New Year's Raffle is being run in aid of Cheshire Young Carers, St Luke's Hospice, The Cheshire Food Hub and other Rotary charities.

Cheshire Young Carers help to give a childhood to children who care for a family member with whom they live. The charity supports young carers through school holiday programmes, group respite sessions, wellbeing family support and by working with schools and colleges to raise awareness and promote early identification of young carers in education.

St Luke's Hospice provides palliative care to local people, supporting them in ways which go beyond the scope and funding of the NHS. Their support ranges from end of life care on their ward to supporting carers, and from helping children cope with grief to helping patients return to work after an illness.

Helping tackle food poverty, the Cheshire Food Hub delivers food to local community groups and redistributes surplus food between community groups, as well as packing food boxes for community groups who cannot offer their usual face-to-face school holiday lunch services.
